Appendix 3

Legislation enacted in 1999

The Companies (Amendment) Act, 1999, which was enacted on 24th May, 1999 and was commenced on the same date, brings Irish company law into line with international practice, by permitting price stabilising on the Irish Stock Exchange in connection with new issues of securities and large offers of existing securities.

The Companies (Amendment) (No. 2) Act, 1999, which provides for amendments to company law in a number of areas, principally examinership, audit and Irish Registered Non Resident companies, was enacted on 15th December 1999 and an Order (S.I. 406 of 1999) setting commencement dates for most of the Act was signed by the Tánaiste and Minister for Enterprise, Trade and Employment on 21 December, 1999.



Appendix 4

Statutory Instruments made during 1999

No. 3 of 1999

Rules of the Superior Courts (No. 1) (Proof of Foreign Diplomatic, Consular and Public Documents), 1999. These rules come into operation on 9 March, 1999 and provide for the addition to Order 39 of the Rules of the Superior Courts pursuant to the ratification of (a) the Convention Abolishing the Legalisation of Documents in the Member States of the European Communities done at Brussels on the 25th May, 1987, (b) the European Convention on the Abolition of Legalisation of Documents Executed by the Diplomatic Agents or Consular Officers done at London on the 7th June, 1968 and (c) the Convention Abolishing the Requirement of Legalisation of Foreign Public Documents done at The Hague on the 5th October, 1961.

No. 10 of 1999

Organisation of Working Time (Public Holiday) Regulations, 1999. These Regulations appointed the 31st December, 1999 to be a special once-off public holiday in celebration of the Millennium.

S.I. 14 of 1999.

The Companies (Forms)(Amendment) Order, 1999 This Order amends the provisions in relation to legalisation requirements for foreign public documents. The effect of the Order will be to make it easier and less costly for business seeking to have documents legalised.

No. 15 of 1999

Consumer Credit Act, 1995 (Section 2) Regulations, 1999. These regulations further supplement the definition of 'credit institution' in the Consumer Credit Act, 1995 by the inclusion of 'Friends First Finance Limited' and 'Fiat Auto Financial Services Ireland'.

S.I. No. 49 of 1999

European Communities (Motor Vehicles Type Approval) Regulations, 1999. The Regulations implement a number of European Community Directives, which relate to air pollution by emissions from motor vehicles.

No 50 of 1999.

European Communities (Undertakings for Collective Investment in Transferable Securities) (Amendment) Regulations, 1999. These Regulations implement the provisions of Directive 95/26/EC in respect of undertakings for collective investment in transferable securities (UCITS). In amending the original UCITS Regulations (S.I. No. 78 of 1989), the Regulations impose new requirements on the auditors of UCITS to report inter alia to the Central Bank breaches of the laws, regulations or administrative provisions relating to UCITS. They also provide for certain exceptions to the general principle of professional secrecy under which the Bank operates and allow, in the interests of more effective regulation, the Bank to share information with other relevant authorities on certain conditions.

S.I. No. 62 of 1999

Prompt Payment of Accounts Act, 1997 (Rate of Interest Penalty) (Amendment) Order, 1999. The Order sets out the interest rate applicable from 6 April, 1999 for late payment on commercial transactions in the public sector.

S.I. 63 of 1999

Companies Act, 1963 (Ninth Schedule) Regulations, 1999. The purpose of this Order is to facilitate the application of Part XI of the Companies Act, 1990, as altered by the Companies Act, 1963 (Ninth Schedule) Regulations, 1999 to unregistered companies, by making some necessary modifications in the application of that Part to such unregistered companies.

S.I. 64 of 1999

The Companies Act, 1963 (Section 377(1)) Order, 1999 The making of the Regulation and Order will permit the purchase of own shares by unregistered companies in the same manner as ordinary companies incorporated under the Companies Acts.

No. 83 of 1999

European Communities (Equipment and Protective Systems Intended for Use in Potentially Explosive atmospheres) Regulations, 1999. These Regulations implement Council Directive 94/9/EC on the approximation of the laws of the Member States concerning equipment and protective systems intended for use in potentially explosive atmospheres.

S.I. No. 113 of 1999

European Communities (Protection of Topographies of Semiconductor Products) (Amendment) Regulations, 1999. These Regulations amend the European Communities (Protection of Topographies of Semiconductor Products) Regulations, 1988 (S.I. No. 101 of 1988).

No. 127 of 1999

Industrial Development (Enterprise Ireland) Act, 1998 (Section 40) (Commencement) Order, 1999. The order appointed the 13th May, 1999 as the day on which Section 40 of the Industrial Development (Enterprise Ireland) Act, 1998 came into operation. The order allows for the designation of certain members of the staff of An Foras Aiseanna Saothair to be transferred to and become members of Forfás.

S.I. No. 137 of 1999

Competition Authority (Witness Summons) Regulations, 1999. These Regulations prescribe a procedure to allow the Competition Authority to summon witnesses, under the Competition Act 1991 and the Competition (Amendment) Act 1996.

S.I. 144 of 1999

The Companies (Amendment) Act, 1999 (Commencement) Order, 1999 This Order fixed the 24th day of May as the day on which the provisions of the Companies (Amendment) Act, 1999 came into operation.

S.I. No. 183 of 1999

European Communities (Motor Vehicles Type Approval)(No.2) Regulations, 1999. The Regulations implement a number of European Community Directives which relate to the doors and steering equipment of motor vehicles.

S.I. No. 184 of 1999

The European Communities (Prohibition of the Sale and Supply of Petroleum and Certain Petroleum Products to the Federal Republic of Yugoslavia) Regulations, 1999. These Regulations provide for penalties for breaches of the EU/UN trade embargo against FRY concerning the sale and supply of petroleum and certain petroleum products to that country.



No. 203 of 1999

European Communities (Export Credit Insurance) Regulations, 1999. These Regulations implement Council Directive 98/92/EC on the harmonisation between Member States of the main provisions concerning export credit insurance for transactions with medium and long-term cover.

No. 232 of 1999

Companies (Fees) Order, 1999. The purpose of this Order is to set the level of fees to be paid in connection with certain provisions of the Companies Acts, 1963 to 1999, with effect from 26 July, 1999.

S.I. No. 235 of 1999

The European Communities (Prevention of Supply of Certain Goods and Services to Libya) (Revocation) Regulations, 1999. These Regulations revoked the Statutory Instrument (S.I. No. 384 of 1993) which provided for penalties for breaches of the partial EU/UN trade embargo with Libya.

No. 263 of 1999

Retail Price (Beverages in Licensed Premises) Display Order, 1999. This Order requires that a 16 item price list be displayed immediately outside or immediately inside the entrance to a licensed premises. The Retail Price (Beverages in Licensed Premises) Display Order, 1976 has been revoked.

S.I. No. 294 of 1999

European Communities (Good Laboratory Practice)(Amendment) Regulations, 1999. The Regulations implement a number of European Community Directives which require that any test on chemical products shall comply with the OECD Principles of Good Laboratory Practice.

No. 325 of 1999

Safety, Health and Welfare at Work (Fishing Vessels) Regulations, 1999. These Regulations transpose the provisions of Council Directive 93/103/EEC concerning the minimum safety and health requirements for work on board fishing vessels.

S.I. No. 345 of 1999

Investor Compensation Act, 1998 (Section 18 (4)) (Prescription of Individuals) (Amendment) Regulations, 1999. The purpose of these Regulations is to provide for the substitution for 'Ms Rady Redmond' of 'Mr Tony McGrath'.

S.I. No. 357 of 1999

European Communities (Ban on the Supply to Indonesia of Equipment which might be used for Internal Repression or Terrorism) Regulations, 1999. These Regulations provided for penalties for breaches of the EU partial trade embargo against Indonesia.

S.I. No. 358 of 1999

European Communities (Motor Vehicles Type Approval) (No.3) Regulations, 1999. The Regulations implement a number of European Community Directives on lamps for motor vehicles, protective devices, passenger hand holds, statutory markings and space for mounting the rear registration plate, for two or three-wheel motor vehicles.

No. 363 of 1999

European Communities (Classification, Packaging, Labelling and Notification of Dangerous Substances)(Amendment) Regulations, 1999. These Regulations implement Commission Directive 98/73/EC of 18 September, 1998, the 24th Adaptation to Technical Progress of Council Directive 67/548/EEC on the classification, packaging and labelling of dangerous substances.

SI No. 386 of 1999

European Communities (Transnational Information and Consultation of Employees Act, 1996) (Amendment) Regulations, 1999. These Regulations give effect to Directive 97/74 EC which extends the European Works Councils Directive to the United Kingdom.

No. 392 of 1999

Consumer Credit Act, 1995 (Section 2) (No.2) Regulations, 1999. These Regulations further supplement the definition of 'credit institution' in the Consumer Credit Act, 1995 by the inclusion of 'Open + Direct Retail Services Limited'.

S.I. No. 399 of 1999

European Communities (Supplementary Supervision of Insurance Undertakings in an Insurance Group) Regulations, 1999. These Regulations implement Directive 98/78/EC. They lay down additional requirements to be met by insurance undertakings within the European Economic Area, which are parts of insurance groups.

S.I. No. 400 of 1999

European Communities (Pressure Equipment) Regulations, 1999. The Regulations implement Directive 97/23/EC which lays down safety requirements with which pressure equipment must comply before being placed on the market.

No. 403 of 1999

Patents and Trade Marks (Fees) Rules 1999. These Regulations restructure certain patent and trade mark fees. They abolish some fee items and introduce new charges for 'dial-in connection' for access to patent and trademark information and for photocopying documents relating to patents.

S.I 406 of 1999

The Companies (Amendment) (No. 2) Act, 1999 (Commencement) Order sets out the commencement dates for most of the Act.

No. 424 of 1999

Dangerous Substances (Retail and Private Petroleum Stores)(Amendment) Regulations, 1999. These Regulations provide for the amendment of the Dangerous Substances (Retail and Private Petroleum Stores) Regulations, 1979, as previously amended by the Dangerous Substances (Retail and Private Petroleum Stores)(Amendment) Regulations, 1988, by extending the date by which premises can operate under existing Regulations.

No. 434 of 1999

Patents and Trade Marks (Fees) (No 2) Rules 1999. These Regulations rectify a minor error in Statutory Instrument No. 403 of 1999

S.I. No. 437 of 1999

Insurance Act, 1989 (Reinsurance) (Form of Notification) Regulations, 1999. These Regulations prescribe the form of notification to be made to the Minister by companies wishing to carry on the business of reinsurance in the State.
