**APPENDIX 2****REPORT ON COMPLIANCE WITH THE PROVISIONS OF THE PROMPT PAYMENT OF ACCOUNTS ACT**

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The Department of Enterprise, Trade and Employment complies with the provisions of the Prompt Payment of Accounts Act, 1997. It is the policy of the Department to settle all invoices promptly with due regard to contractual terms where applicable, good financial and cash management practices and the provisions of the Act.

The target turnaround time in the Finance Unit for the payment of invoices is 5 days from the date of receipt of completed payment authorisation forms together with supporting documentation. Instructions have been issued by the Finance Unit to all staff processing payments to ensure that the provisions of the Prompt Payments legislation are complied with.

During 2001, out of total invoiced payments of over €33m, 61 invoices totalling €197,083.83 incurred penalty interest of €2,307.28. Of the late payments, 44 were for amounts over €317.43 (£250) to a total value of €194,158.60 and involved interest payments of €2,255.99. The delays were up to 30 days in 50 cases, from 31 to 60 days in 4 cases and in excess of 60 days in 7 cases.

Comparing performance with 2000, the overall value of invoiced payments did not change significantly. The value of all late payments as a proportion of all invoiced payments is lower at 0.59% (down from 0.86% in 2000). However, the number of late payments is up from 47 and the total amount of interest paid is up from €1,815.29 in 2000.

## APPENDIX 4

## LEGISLATION ENACTED IN 2001

**The Industrial Relations (Amendment) Act 2001 (No. 11 of 2001)**, which came into operation on 31 May 2001, provides a new dispute settling power for the Labour Court for use where collective bargaining arrangements are not in place and the employer has failed to follow the procedures provided for in the Code of Practice on Voluntary Dispute Resolution (S.I. 145 of 2000).

**The Carer's Leave Act 2001 (No. 19 of 2001)**, which came into operation on 2 July 2001, provides for a new entitlement for employees to avail of up to 65 weeks unpaid leave from their employment to enable them to care personally for persons who require full-time care and attention. The Carer's Leave Act fulfilled the Government commitment in Budget 2000 and in the Programme for Prosperity and Fairness that legislation would be introduced to give effect to a Carer's Benefit payment and a parallel right to carer's leave.

**The Nitrigin Eireann Teoranta Act 2001 (No. 21 of 2001)**, came into effect on 3 July 2001. The Act provides for the transfer of liability for the repayment of Nitrigin Eireann Teoranta's State-guaranteed debt to the Minister for Finance. The Act also amends the First Schedule to the National Treasury Management Agency Act 1990 to enable the Minister for Finance to delegate responsibility to the NTMA for the repayment of NET's debt. In addition, the Act makes provision for legislative changes which would be required in the event of a future sale by NET of its 51% shareholding in Irish Fertilizer Industries Ltd.

**The Company Law Enforcement Act 2001 (No. 28 of 2001)** was signed by the President on 9 July 2001. The main provisions of the Act are the establishment of the Director of Corporate Enforcement and the assignment to him of powers and functions. The Act transfers to the Director the functions of the Minister for Enterprise, Trade and Employment relating to investigation and enforcement of the Companies Acts. It establishes on a statutory basis the Company Law Review Group to monitor, review and advise the Minister on matters relating to company law. The Act also amends in various ways the Companies Act 1963, the Companies Act 1990 and other Acts.

**The Industrial Designs Act 2001 (Number 39 of 2001)**, which gives effect to EU Directive 98/71/EC on the legal protection of designs in Ireland, was enacted on 27 November 2001. This Act is not yet in force, however, due to the necessity to draft and implement the required secondary legislation to give effect to the Act in practice.

**The Protection of Employees (Part-Time Work) Act 2001 (No. 45 of 2001)**, which came into operation on 20 December 2001, implements the provisions of Directive 97/81/EC of the Council of the European Union concerning the Framework Agreement on Part-Time Work concluded by the general cross-industry organisations at European level – UNICE, CEEP and ETUC.

The Act outlaws discrimination against part-time workers vis-à-vis comparable full-time workers on the ground of their part-time status. It also aims to facilitate access to part-time work on a voluntary basis, to improve the quality of part-time work and generally to contribute to the flexible organisation of working time in a manner which takes into account the needs of employers and workers.

In line with the Government's PPF commitments, the Act includes pay and pensions as part of the conditions of employment for part-time employees.

These Regulations came into effect on 17th January, 2001, and transpose Council Directive 96/35/EC on the appointment and vocational qualification by examination of safety advisers for the transport of dangerous goods by road and rail and the associated Council Directive 2000/18/EC on minimum examination requirements for safety advisers for the transport of dangerous goods by road and rail.

**S.I. No. 9 of 2001**

Trade Marks Act, 1996 (Section 66) Regulations, 2001. These Regulations enable certain details regarding the seniority of Community Trade Marks to be recorded in the Register of Trade Marks

**S.I. No. 15 of 2001**

The Life Assurance (Provision of Information) Regulation, 2001 came into effect on 1st February, 2001. The Regulations apply to the provision of life assurance by insurers and insurance intermediaries. They provide for the disclosure of information at point of sale to individual purchasers of life assurance and apply to policies signed on or after 1st February, 2001. In addition, the Regulations place an obligation on insurers and their actuary to furnish certain information to the Minister at the end of each financial year.

These provisions are in addition to the provisions of the 3rd Life Directive in relation to policyholder information and the "cooling off" period which have been transposed into Irish law by the European Communities (Life Assurance) Framework Regulations, 1994.

**S.I. No. 41 of 2001**

Redundancy Payments (Lump Sum) Regulations, 2001. These Regulations raised the ceiling on annual reckonable earnings to be taken into account in the calculation of a statutory redundancy lump sum payment from £15,600 (£300 per week) to £20,800 (£400 per week) from 1st April, 2001 i.e from €19,807.91 (€380.92 per week) to €26,410.55 (€507.90 per week).

**S.I. No. 42 of 2001**

Protection of Employees (Employers' Insolvency)(Variation of Limit) Regulations, 2001. These regulations increased the weekly limit payable in some cases in respect of claims under the Insolvency Payments Scheme from £300 per week to £400 per week with effect from 1st April, 2001.

**S.I. No. 54 of 2001**

Chemical Weapons (Licensing of Scheduled Toxic Chemicals and Precursors) Regulations, 2001. These Regulations came

into operation on 23rd February, 2001. The purpose of the Regulations is to establish a licensing system relating to the production, use, acquisition, or possession of a toxic chemical or precursor listed in the First Schedule to the Chemical Weapons Act, 1997 (No. 28 of 1997), in accordance with the provisions of Sections 4 and 12 of that Act.

**S.I. No. 72 of 2001**

European Communities (Reduction of Certain Economic Relations with the Federal Republic of Yugoslavia) (Amendment) Regulations, 2001. These Regulations amend the Regulations that had been introduced to provide for penalties for Breaches of Council Regulation (EC) No. 926/98.

**S.I. No. 78 of 2001**

Safety, Health and Welfare at Work (Carcinogens) Regulations, 2001. These Regulations came into operation on 8th March, 2001 and give effect to Council Directive 90/394/EEC of 28 June, 1990 as amended by Directive 97/42/EC of 27 June, 1997 and 1999/38/EC of 29 April, 1999 on the protection of workers from the risks related to exposure to carcinogens and mutagens at work (Sixth individual Directive within the meaning of Article 16(1) of Directive 89/391/EEC).

**S.I. No. 87 of 2001**

Irish Takeover Panel Act, 1997 (Relevant Company) Regulations, 2001. These Regulations expand the definition of "relevant company" that shall be subject to the jurisdiction of the Irish Takeover Panel for the purposes of the Irish Takeover Panel Act, 1997. The Panel's remit currently covers Irish-registered public limited companies or other bodies corporate, the securities of which are authorised to be traded on the Irish Stock Exchange (or have been so authorised within the preceding five years). Under these Regulations, public limited companies incorporated in the State and authorised to trade on the London Stock Exchange, the New York Stock Exchange, Nasdaq, EASDAQ and the Neuer Markt will now come within the Panel's remit.

Public limited companies incorporated in the State which are not currently authorised to trade on the London Stock Exchange, the New York Stock Exchange, Nasdaq, EASDAQ and the Neuer Markt but were so authorised in the previous five years will also come within the Panel's remit. These Regulations came into operation on 26th of March, 2001.

**S.I. No. 97 of 2001**

European Communities (Prohibition of the Sale and Supply of Petroleum and Certain Petroleum Products to the Federal Republic of Yugoslavia) Regulations 2001. These Regulations revoke the prohibition of the sale and supply of Petroleum and certain Petroleum Products to the Federal Republic of Yugoslavia.

## APPENDIX 5

## STATUTORY INSTRUMENTS MADE DURING 2001

**S.I. No. 188 of 2001**

Safety, Health and Welfare at Work (General Application) (Amendment) Regulations, 2001. These Regulations came into operation on 2nd May, 2001. The Regulations, which amend the Safety, Health and Welfare at Work (General Application) Regulations, 1993 (S.I. No. 44 of 1993), give effect to Council Directive 95/63/EC amending Council Directive 89/655/EEC concerning the minimum safety and health requirements for the use of work equipment by workers at work.

**S.I. No. 207 of 2001**

European Communities (Protection of Consumers in Respect of Contracts made by means of Distance Communication) Regulations, 2001. These Regulations apply to contracts for goods or services (other than financial services) to be supplied to a consumer where the contract is made exclusively by means of distance communications i.e. without the simultaneous physical presence of the supplier and the consumer.

**S.I. No. 218 of 2001**

Safety, Health and Welfare at Work (Confined Spaces) Regulations, 2001. These Regulations came into operation on 31st August, 2001. The Regulations impose requirements and prohibitions with respect to the safety and health of persons carrying out work in confined spaces, as defined in Regulation 2(1). They apply to all work activities involving confined spaces, with the exception of activities below ground at a mine and diving operations.

**S.I. No. 219 of 2001**

Safety, Health and Welfare at Work (Repeal of Section 38 of Factories Act, 1955)(Commencement) Order, 2001. This Order came into operation on 31st August, 2001. The purpose of this Order is to activate the repeal (as provided for in Sections 1(2) and 4(3) of the Safety, Health and Welfare at Work Act, 1989) of Section 38 of the Factories Act, 1955, as amended by Section 21 of the Safety in Industry Act, 1980, on the coming into operation of the Safety, Health and Welfare at Work (Confined Spaces) Regulations, 2001, which, inter alia, replace those provisions.

**S.I. No. 232 of 2001**

Industrial Relations (Amendment) Act, 2001 (Commencement) Order, 2001. This Order came into effect on 31st May, 2001 and appointed that day as the day on which the Industrial Relations (Amendment) Act, 2001 came into operation.

**S.I. No. 283 of 2001**

European Communities (Units of Measurement) (Amendment) Regulations, 2001. These Regulations provide for a further extension of the time period during which conversion of road distance and speed measurement signs to units of the metric system may be carried out.

**S.I. No. 346 of 2001**

Trade Marks (Madrid Protocol) Regulations, 2001. These Regulations provide for the implementation in Ireland of the Protocol Relating to the Madrid Agreement Concerning the International Registration of Marks.

**S.I. No. 350 of 2001**

Protection of Young Persons (Employment) Act, 1996 (Employment in Licensed Premises) Regulations, 2001. These Regulations concern young persons (16 and 17 year olds) employed to carry out general duties in a licensed premises (as defined). For the purposes of the Regulations, "general duties" do not include supplying intoxicating liquor from behind the bar counter in licensed premises or supplying it for consumption off those premises.

The Regulations provide that the young person may be required to work up to 11 p.m. in such premises on a day, which is not a day immediately preceding a school day, during a school term where the young person is attending school. The Regulations also provide that, in such circumstances, the young person may not commence work before 7 a.m. on the following day.

The Regulations also provide that the employer of a young person employed to carry out general duties in a licensed premises shall have regard to the Code of Practice concerning the Employment of Young Persons in Licensed Premises, the terms of which are set out in the Schedule to the Regulations.

**S.I. No. 351 of 2001**

Protection of Young Persons (Employment) Act, 1996 (Bar Apprentices) Regulations, 2001. These Regulations provide that a young person (a 16 or 17 year old) employed as an apprentice in a fulltime capacity in a licensed premises (as defined), may be required to work up to midnight on any one day and not before 8 a.m. on the following day provided that the young person is supervised by an adult.

**S.I. No. 369 of 2001**

European Communities (Authorised Agencies) (Issue of Certificates of Origin) (Amendment) Regulations, 2001. These Regulations add Swords Fingal Chamber of Commerce to the schedule of agencies authorised to issue certificates of origin.

**S.I. No. 378 of 2001**

Credit Union Act, 1997 (Commencement) Order, 2001. This Order appoints 1 August 2001 as the date when sections 46 to 52 of the Credit Union Act 1997 come into operation.

**APPENDIX 5****STATUTORY INSTRUMENTS MADE DURING 2001****S.I. No. 391 of 2001**

Company Law Enforcement Act, 2001 (Commencement) Order, 2001. This Order provides for sections 1 to 6 and section 111 of the Company Law Enforcement Act 2001 to become effective from 4 August 2001.

**S.I. No. 416 of 2001**

European Communities (Introducing Certain Restrictive Measures in respect of Liberia) Regulations, 2001. These Regulations provide for penalties where the provisions of Council Regulation (EC) No. 1146/2001 are breached.

**S.I. No. 417 of 2001**

European Communities (Prohibition of the Export of Certain Goods and Services to Afghanistan and Strengthening of the Flight Ban) Regulations, 2001. These Regulations provide for penalties where the provisions of Council Regulation (EC) No. 467/2001 are breached

**S.I. No. 419 of 2001**

Organisation of Working Time (National Day of Mourning) Regulations 2001. These Regulations appointed Friday, 14th September 2001 to be a National Day of Mourning in sympathy with all those killed and injured in the terrorist attacks in the United States of America on Tuesday, 11th September 2001.

**S.I. No. 422 of 2001**

European Communities (Requirements to Indicate Product Prices) Regulations, 2001. The Regulations apply to most products offered for sale by traders to consumers. Subject to the exceptions specified, where traders indicate that a product is or may be for sale to consumers, they are required to indicate the selling price and the unit price of that product in accordance with the provisions of the Regulations. The indication of the selling price and of the unit price must be clearly visible.

**S.I. No. 429 of 2001**

European Communities (Motor Vehicles Type Approval) Regulations, 2001. These Regulations implement a number of European Community Directives on air pollution by emissions of gaseous and particulate pollutants and tyres of motor vehicles.

**S.I. No. 432 of 2001**

Consumer Credit Act, 1995 (Section 2) Regulations, 2001. These Regulations further supplement the definition of "credit institution" in the Consumer Credit Act, 1995 to include Arnotts plc., Asgard Financial Services Limited and Irish Permanent (IOM) Limited.

**S.I. No. 437 of 2001**

European Communities (Single-Member Private Limited Companies) Regulations, 1994 (Amendment) Regulations, 2001. These Regulations provide that the European Communities (Single-Member Private Limited Companies) Regulations, 1994 are amended by the deletion of Regulation 12 with effect from 1 October 2001.

**S.I. No. 438 of 2001**

Company Law Enforcement Act, 2001 (Commencement) (No. 2) Order, 2001. This Order provides that sections 47, 62, 66 to 71, 75 to 79, 80 to 83, 85 to 87, 89, 90, 91(b), 92, 93 (except in so far as it inserts subparagraph (ii) of paragraph (fa) into section 213 of the Companies Act, 1963, 94, 95, 98, 100, 102 to 106, 108 and 114 of the Company Law Enforcement Act 2001 become effective from 1 October 2001. It also provides that sections 63(1)(b), 64 and 99 of the Act become effective from 26 October 2001. The Order also appoints 1 March 2002 as the day when sections 59, 60, 61, 63(1)(a), 63(2), 65 and 84(a) come into operation.

**S.I. No. 439 of 2001**

Companies Act, 1990 (Section 34) Regulations, 2001. These Regulations set out the form of the report of the independent person which is required to accompany the statutory declaration, under section 34 of the Companies Act 1990 as amended by section 78 of the Company Law Enforcement Act 2001.

**S.I. No. 440 of 2001**

Investor Compensation Act, 1998 (Section 18(4)) (Prescription of Individuals) (Amendment) Regulations, 2001. These Regulations provide for the substitution of an individual member on the Board of the Investor Compensation Company Limited.

**S.I. No. 449 of 2001**

European Communities (Injunctions to Protect Consumers' Collective Interests) Regulations, 2001. Under these Regulations, qualified entities will be entitled, for the purpose of protecting the collective interests of consumers, to apply to the Circuit Court for an order requiring the cessation or prohibition of an infringement of the national law which transposed specified Directives concerning misleading advertising; contracts negotiated away from business premises; consumer credit; television broadcasting activities; package travel; advertising of medicinal products; unfair terms in consumer contracts; timeshare; and distance contracts. As regards intra-community infringements, the Minister for Enterprise, Trade and Employment will at the request of national qualified entities be required to inform the European Commission about them.

**APPENDIX 5****STATUTORY INSTRUMENTS MADE DURING 2001****S.I. No. 466 of 2001**

Companies (Forms) Order, 2001. The purpose of this Order is to amend the Companies (Forms) Order, 1964 (S.I. No. 45 of 1964) by replacing Form 47 with Form C1.

**S.I. No. 467 of 2001**

European Communities (Prohibition of the Export of Certain Goods and Services to Afghanistan and Strengthening of the Flight Ban) (Amendment) Regulations, 2001. These Regulations amend regulations that had been introduced to provide for penalties for breaches of Council Regulation (EC) No. 467/2001. These amendments give effect to Commission Regulation (EC) No. 1354/2001.

**S.I. No. 473 of 2001**

Organisation of Working Time (Records) (Prescribed Form and Exemptions) Regulations 2001. The main purpose of these Regulations is to require employers, pursuant to the Organisation of Working Time Act 1997, to keep:

- (i) a record of the number of hours worked by employees (excluding meal and rest breaks) on a daily and weekly basis;
- (ii) a record of leave granted to employees in each week by way of annual leave or in respect of a public holiday and payment made in respect of that leave;
- (iii) a weekly record of the notification and starting and finishing times of employees.

The Regulations also require employers to keep a copy of the statement provided to each employee under the provisions of the Terms of Employment (Information) Act 1994.

The Regulations also provide for exemptions, subject to certain conditions, in relation to the keeping by employers of records of rest breaks and rest periods of employees under the Organisation of Working Time Act 1997.

**S.I. No. 476 of 2001**

Credit Union Act, 1997 (Alteration of Financial Limit) Regulations, 2001. These Regulations substitute “£50” for “£1,000” in section 27(1)(b) of the Credit Union Act 1997 from commencement until 31 December 2001, and “€63” after that date.

**S.I. No. 477 of 2001**

Companies (Fees) Order, 2001. This Order introduces a progressively increasing late filing fee where an annual return is not received by the registrar on time. Various fees charged by the Registrar of Companies are also converted to their euro equivalents by this Order.

**S.I. No. 481 of 2001**

Safety, Health and Welfare at Work (Construction) Regulations, 2001. These Regulations came into operation on 1st January, 2002. The purpose of these Regulations is to amend the Safety, Health and Welfare at Work (Construction) Regulations, 1995 and to give further effect to Council Directive 92/57/EEC on the minimum safety and health requirements at temporary or mobile construction sites. The amended Regulations include new provisions for mandatory safety training and safety representation as well as providing for more effective arrangements in ensuring the availability of adequate welfare facilities by requiring the Project Supervisor, Construction Stage, to co-ordinate the provisions of these facilities on site.

**S.I. No. 482 of 2001**

Patents, Trade Marks and Designs (Fees) Rules, 2001. These Regulations contain fees in euro amounts in respect of patents, trade marks and designs.

**S.I. No. 484 of 2001**

National Standards Authority of Ireland Act, 1996 (Section 32) Regulations 2001. These regulations enable Local Authorities to summarily prosecute an offence in contravention of Statutory Instrument No. 257 of 1991 concerning the sale, manufacture and assembly for domestic use of petroleum coke and other solid fuels.

**S.I. No. 492 of 2001**

Carriage of Dangerous Goods by Road Regulations, 2001. These Regulations will come into effect on 1st April, 2002. These Regulations apply to the carriage, both in bulk and in packages, of dangerous goods by road, including the loading and unloading of the dangerous goods in relation to their carriage.

**S.I. No. 493 of 2001**

Carriage of Dangerous Goods by Road Act, 1998 (Appointment of Competent Authorities) Order, 2001. This Order will come into effect on 1st April, 2002. Section 4 of the Carriage of Dangerous Goods by Road Act, 1998 gives the Minister for Enterprise, Trade and Employment power to appoint competent authorities to perform functions conferred by the Act and by Regulations made under the Act.

**APPENDIX 5****STATUTORY INSTRUMENTS MADE DURING 2001****S.I. No. 494 of 2001**

Carriage of Dangerous Goods by Road (Fees) Regulations, 2001. These Regulations will come into effect on 1st April, 2002. These Regulations are required as part of the Carriage of Dangerous Goods by Road Regulations, 2001 which implement Council Directive 94/55/EC of 21 November, 1994 (on the transport of dangerous goods by road), as amended by Directive 2000/61/EC of the European Parliament and the Council and as adapted to technical progress by Commission Directives 98/86/EC of 13 December, 1996 and 1999/47/EC of 21 May, 1999. They entitle a competent authority or designated authority to charge for the provision of services.

**S.I. No. 495 of 2001**

Carriage of Dangerous Goods by Road Act, 1998 (Commencement) Order, 2001. This Order fixes the 1st April, 2002 as the day on which the Carriage of Dangerous Goods by Road, Act, 1998 shall come into operation.

**S.I. No. 518 of 2001**

European Communities (Machinery) Regulations, 2001. These Regulations give effect in Irish law to Directive 98/37/EC, which was a consolidation Directive, replacing a number of earlier Directives relating to Machinery.

**S.I. No. 523 of 2001**

Company Law Enforcement Act, 2001 (Commencement) (No. 3) Order, 2001. This order provides that sections 7 to 24, 25(b), 26 to 39, 72 to 74, 96, 97, 112 and 113 of the Company Law Enforcement Act 2001 become effective from 28 November 2001. It also provides that section 88 of the Act will be effective from 1 March 2002.

**S.I. No. 524 of 2001**

Company Law Enforcement Act, 2001 (Section 34) Regulations, 2001. These Regulations allow for the examination of books and documents of certain companies, authorised under section 19 of the Companies Act 1990, to be continued by the authorised officer for a period after the commencement of section 34 of the Company Law Enforcement Act 2001.

**S.I. No. 547 of 2001**

European Communities (Prohibition of the Export of Certain Goods and Services to Afghanistan and Strengthening of the Flight Ban)(Amendment)(No.2) Regulations, 2001. These Regulations further amend regulations that had been introduced to provide for penalties for breaches of Council Regulation (EC) No. 467/ 2001. These amendments give effect to Commission Regulation (EC) No. 1996/ 2001.

**S.I. No. 554 of 2001**

European Communities (Motor Vehicles Type Approval) (No. 2) Regulations, 2001. These Regulations implement a number of European Community Motor Vehicle Directives on doors, safety glazing and glazing materials, and heating systems.

**S.I. No. 560 of 2001**

Hallmarking (Approved Hallmarks) Regulations, 2001. The purpose of these Regulations is to prescribe the hallmarks and fineness marks which can be applied to articles of precious metal consisting of or containing gold, silver and platinum by the Dublin Assay Office. These Regulations revoke and replace the Hallmarking (Approved Hallmarks) Regulations, 1983 (S.I. No. 327 of 1983), and the Hallmarking (Approved Hallmarks) (Amendment) Regulations, 1990 (S.I. No. 139 of 1990).

**S.I. No. 561 of 2001**

Hallmarking (Irish Standards of Fineness) Regulations, 2001. These Regulations prescribe the standards of finenesses for articles of precious metal consisting of or containing gold, silver and platinum. These Regulations revoke and replace the Hallmarking (Irish Standards of Fineness) Regulations, 1983 (S.I. No 328 of 1983), and the Hallmarking (Irish Standards of Fineness)(Amendment) Regulations, 1990. (S.I. No. 138 of 1990).

**S.I. No. 569 of 2001**

Companies (Fees) (No. 2) Order, 2001. This order amends Part I of the Eighth Schedule (inserted by the Companies (Fees) Order, 2001 (S.I. No. 477 of 2001) to the Companies Act 1963 by the substitution for "€3.50" of "€2.50" opposite the entry in the first column that reads "For the provision of an uncertified copy of any matter entered in a register aforesaid".

**S.I. No. 570 of 2001**

Limited Partnership Regulations, 2001. These Regulations set the level of fees, in euro amounts, to be paid in connection with certain provisions of the Limited Partnerships Act, 1907.

**S.I. No. 571 of 2001**

Companies Act, 1963 (Section 24) Regulations, 2001. These Regulations set out the form of the Statutory Declaration of Compliance which is required to be made where a company or proposed company wishes to be exempt from the provisions of the Companies Acts relating to the use of the word 'limited' or 'teoranta' as part of its name.

**S.I. No. 572 of 2001**

Business Names Regulations, 2001. These Regulations set the level of fees, in euro amounts, to be paid in connection with certain provisions of the Registration of Business Names Act, 1963.

**APPENDIX 5****STATUTORY INSTRUMENTS MADE DURING 2001****S.I. No. 579 of 2001**

European Communities (Hallmarking of Articles Imported from Other Member States) Regulations, 2001. The purpose of these Regulations is to provide that articles consisting of or containing gold, silver or platinum marketed in Ireland with hallmarks lawfully applied in another Member State, with a sponsor's or maker's mark, applied by a body which offers a guarantee of independence, and which provide the consumer with information that is intelligible to consumers in Ireland and equivalent to the marks referred to in the Hallmarking Act and to the Regulations made under the Act do not require any further assay or hallmark in Ireland.

**S.I. No. 581 of 2001**

Protection of Employees (Employers' Insolvency) (Forms and Procedure)(Amendment) Regulations, 2001. These regulations, which take effect from 1st January 2002, prescribe revised formats of forms and certificates and amalgamate some forms used in connection with submission of claims under the Insolvency Payments Scheme.

**S.I. No. 584 of 2001**

Dangerous Substances (Retail and Private Petroleum Stores)(Amendment) Regulations, 2001. These Regulations came into effect on 1st January, 2002. These Regulations provide for the amendment of the Dangerous Substances (Retail and Private Petroleum Stores) Regulations, 1979, as previously amended by the Dangerous Substances (Retail and Private Petroleum Stores)(Amendment) Regulations, 1988, and the Dangerous Substances (Retail and Private Petroleum Stores) (Amendment) Regulations, 1999. Under the Regulations, as adapted by Section 29 of the Safety, Health and Welfare at Work Act, 1989 (No. 7 of 1989), a retail and private petroleum store requires to be licensed by the local or harbour authority or, where the store is owned by such authority, by the National Authority for Occupational Safety and Health.

**S.I. No. 619 of 2001**

Safety, Health and Welfare at Work (Chemical Agents) Regulations, 2001. These Regulations came into operation on 19th December 2001 and transpose Council Directive 98/24/EC of 7th April, 1998 on the protection of the health and safety of workers from the risks related to chemical agents at work. The Regulations also transpose the related Commission Directive 2000/39/EC of 8th June, 2000, establishing a first list of indicative occupational exposure limit values in implementation of Council Directive 98/24/EC, through an approved Code of Practice.

**S.I. No. 632 of 2001**

European Communities (Noise Emission by Equipment for use Outdoors) Regulations, 2001. These Regulations give effect to EU Directive 2000/14/EC on Noise Emission in the Environment by Equipment for Use Outdoors.

**S.I. No. 636 of 2001**

Protection of Employees (Part-Time Work) Act 2001 (Commencement) Order 2001. This Order appoints the 20th Day of December 2001 as the day on which the Protection of Employees (Part-Time Work) Act 2001 (No. 45 of 2001) comes into operation.

**S.I. No. 648 of 2001**

European Communities (Supplementary Protection Certificate) (Amendment) Regulations, 2001. These Regulations set out the fee payable in euro upon filing of a request for a Supplementary Protection Certificate.
