

## <u>Public consultation on the National Minimum Wage (NMW) and on the board and</u> lodging allowances provided for under the National Minimum Wage

The Low Pay Commission is an independent body, the main function of which is to advise the Government on the appropriate rate of the National Minimum Wage.

The Commission has also been requested, as part of its 2017 work programme, to review the allowances for board and lodgings provided for under the National Minimum Wage Act 2000. These allowances are amounts which an employer is permitted to deduct from wages where meals or accommodation are provided by the employer.

The Commission is now seeking submissions from interested parties in relation to these matters. With regard to the board and lodgings consultation the Commission would particularly like to hear from employers and employees where these allowances are currently in use. Consequently, when submitting material, parties should specify any information which they consider should not be released, and identify the grounds under the Act which support the non-release of the information.
